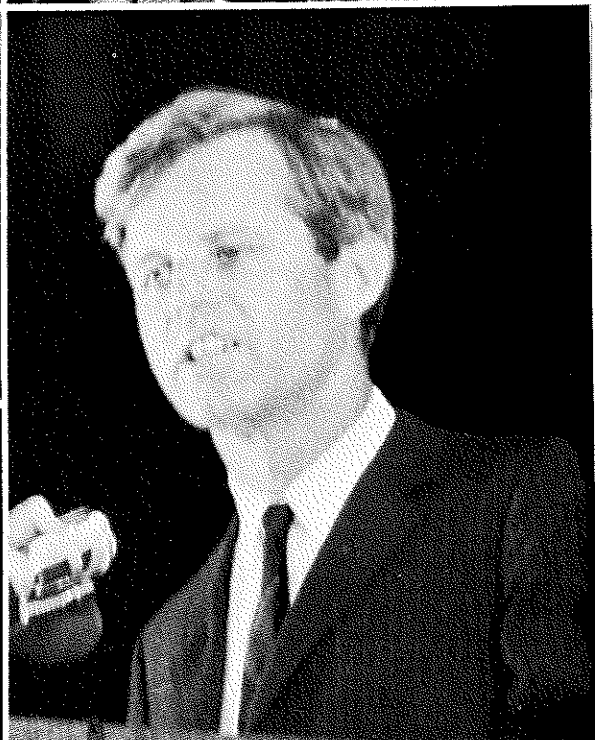
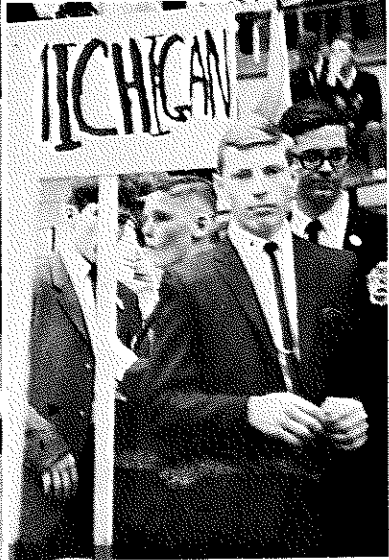
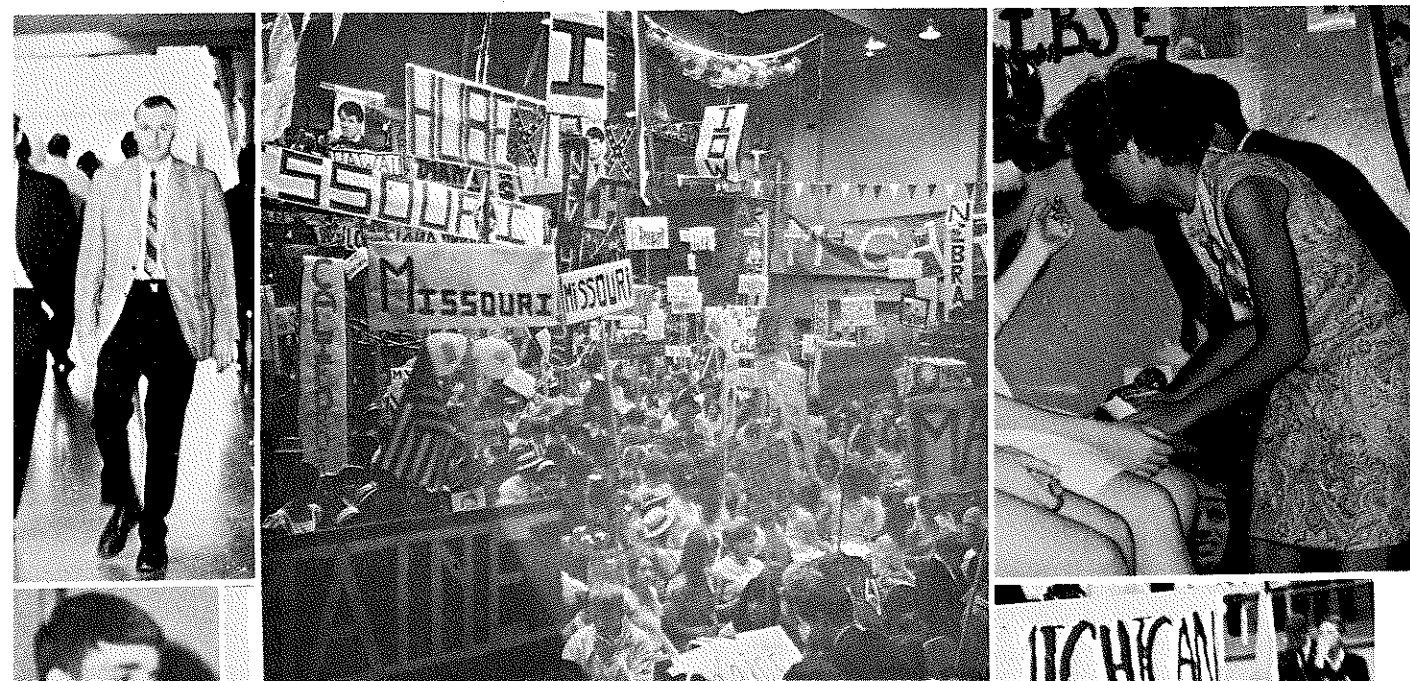
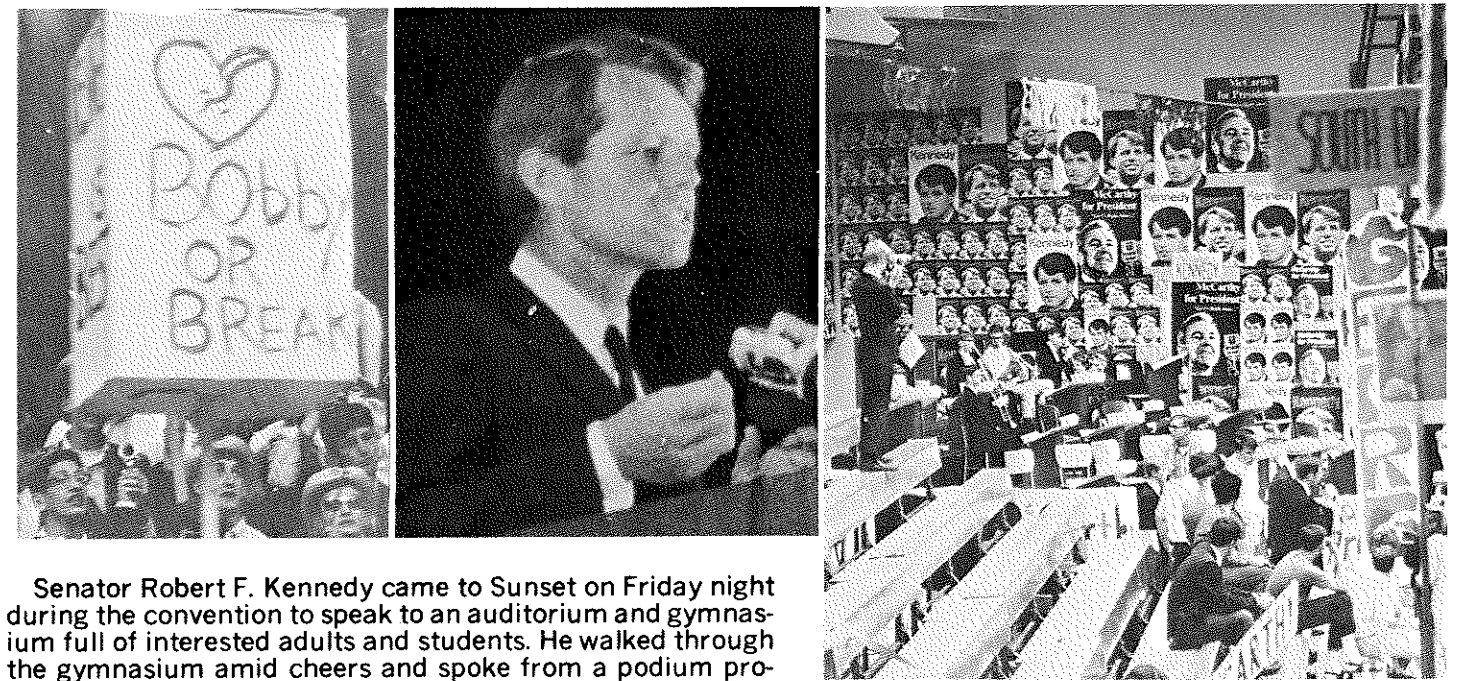


In Memory of Bobby



Special speakers included: Phil McAlmond, candidate for U.S. Senator; Robert Straub, Treasurer of Oregon; Ed Fabley, State Senator and Oregon Party Chairman; Mrs. Edith Green, U.S. Representative; Mary McCarthy, daughter of Eugene McCarthy, Senator from Wisconsin and candidate for President; and Robert Kennedy, Senator from New York and candidate for President.

The convention closed on Saturday afternoon after three days of arguing and voting with every participant having learned or almost learned the way our country elects its presidents.



Senator Robert F. Kennedy came to Sunset on Friday night during the convention to speak to an auditorium and gymnasium full of interested adults and students. He walked through the gymnasium amid cheers and spoke from a podium protected by Sunset students. Though he did make a speech, most of his time at Sunset was used to shake hands and sign autographs for his student supporters.

He said to the people gathered: "...then she said that if I ran I'd have to go to Oregon. And when I was in Oregon I would have to go to Sunset. And I said 'isn't that nice.'" "I hear he doesn't even know the difference between Sunset and Beaverton!" Senator Kennedy was assassinated on June 6 in Los Angeles.
